CALIFORNIA FARMWORKER COALITION LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

The California Farmworker Coalition creates opportunities to make change for farmworkers' through state policy and takes action to make their voices heard in Sacramento. The following Coalition priorities were approved by voting membership.

2025 STATE POLICIES IN SUPPORT

AB 694 (McKinnor) - Strengthening California's Health & Safety Enforcement Workforce - CO-SPONSOR

Increase and diversify CalOSHA's enforcement positions through a workforce development pipeline program.

AB 1234 (Ortega) - Timely Wage Theft Recovery Act

Improve the efficiency and effectiveness of wage claim process and encourage compliance with labor laws.

AB 1362 (Kalra) - Foreign Labor Contractors

Require foreign labor contractors to register with the CA Labor Commissioners Office.

AB 1336 (Addis) - Farmworker Climate Change Heat Injury and Death Fund

Provide for timely medical treatment to farmworkers who experiences a heat-related injury.

SB 310 (Weiner) - Penalty for Wage Theft

Permit workers to receive the penalty that employers have to pay for wage theft through the courts.

SB 578 (Smallwood-Cuevas) - Permanent & Expanded California Worker Outreach Program

Establishes the CA Worker Outreach Program as a permanent program in Labor Code.

SB 846 (McNerney) - Liens on Ag Employers

Allow the use of liens on ag employers for wage theft.
